Growing Pains



Gospel. In today's Jesus has made the journey annual to Jerusalem to attend Passover ceremonies with his parents. At age 12 he is preparing for his Bar Mitzvah, but that ceremony is not planned for another year. Jesus, however, is ready now to the transition make between childhood and

adult faith. By demonstrating his great understanding in the temple, he shows he is ready to take on greater responsibility. He knows his heavenly Father and is willing to follow. Today's readings teach us the requirements of adult faith. The first reading from the Book of Sirach gives readers an in-depth look at

honouring your father, while the reading from Colossians gives an overview of all we are to become. First we learn that paying consistent heed to a commandment throughout our lives will reap untold benefits. adult understanding commandment is not an easy one; we need to walk through good times as well as bad, always deepening our trust in God. As we age, our adult faith is tested. If we choose to deepen our faith, we become the person described in Colossians — someone clothed in compassion and love and peace. The first reading demonstrates how we walk toward adult faith: the second reading explains that once we have done all we can, we become compassionate, loving and peaceful. This is the goal of adult faith. What does adult faith look like? The Gospel reading teaches us that adult faith can be both unexpected and daring. We also learn that we must ponder all the events of our lives in order to understand the ways of God. In staying behind in the temple with teachers and elders, Jesus steps outside accepted practice. He should be following his parents home, but he has found a higher calling. Somewhere in his journey toward Passover with his earthly parents he has come to understand that he is the beloved Son of God. He stays in the temple to further explore his new understanding, leaving his parents first to worry and finally to ponder his unexpected actions. As adolescents and young adults, each of us experienced growing pains as we defined who we were separate from our parents. This psychological definition of ourselves usually has a beginning and an end. Spiritual identity and maturity are not so clear-cut. Each day our actions either define us as spiritual adults or spiritual children. Are we living the commandments in depth or do we adhere to a superficial understanding and bail out when the going gets tough? Do we listen to the voice of God within us? Are we brave enough to step outside of the norm when required? By all accounts, Jesus was disobeying his earthly parents. He had the courage to follow a deeper commandment and honour his heavenly Father. Do we have that same courage? The courage to listen and respond to God's word is sorely needed in our world today. When events in our lives startle and surprise us, do we have the courage to ponder them as Mary did? It is so tempting to react rather than to respond. Today is a day to renew our own confirmation promises, expand our understanding of our spiritual lives and embrace all of our adult responsibilities. It is a tall order, but with the help of God we can succeed.
