St. Anselm's Ecology Group Encyclical Letter of the Holy Father Francis Laudato Si' Chapter One What is Happening to Our Common Home? IV. Decline in the Quality of Human Life and the Breakdown of Society

45. In some places, rural and urban alike, the privatization of certain spaces has restricted people's access to places of particular beauty. In others, "ecological" neighborhoods have been created which are closed to outsiders in order to ensure an artificial tranquility. Frequently, we find beautiful and carefully manicured green spaces in so-called "safer" areas of cities, but not in the more hidden areas where the disposable of society live.

The social dimensions of global change include of technological the effects innovations on social exclusion, employment, an inequitable distribution and consumption of energy and other services, social breakdown, increased violence, and a rise in new forms of social aggression, drug trafficking, growing drug use by young people, and the loss of identity. These are signs that the growth of the past two centuries has not always led to an integral development and an improvement in the quality of life. Some of these signs are also symptomatic of real social decline, the silent rupture of the bond of integration and social cohesion.



Ash Wednesday



"Turn Away From Sin and Follow the Gospel"

The call to continuing conversion reflected in the readings for Ash Wednesday is also the message of the ashes. We move through Lent from

ashes to the baptismal font. We dirty our faces on Ash Wednesday and are cleansed in the waters of the font. More profoundly, we embrace the need to die to sin and selfishness at the beginning of Lent so that we can come to fuller life in the Risen One at Easter. When we receive ashes on our foreheads, we remember who we are. We remember that we are creatures of the earth. We remember that we are mortal beings. We remember that we are baptized. We remember that we are people on a journey of conversion. We remember that we are members of the body of Christ and that smudge on our foreheads will proclaim that identity to others, too. Renewing our sense of who we really are before God is the core of the Lenten experience. It is so easy to forget and fall into habits of sin, ways of thinking and living that are contrary to God's will. From the very beginning of Lent, God's word calls us to conversion. That, simply put, is the reason for Ash Wednesday!

What is turning our eyes from Christ? How can we give up on the old ways to prepare for a new life in Christ? What can we give up in order to become the holy people God calls us to be?
