THE PASSION ACCORDING TO LUKE



Luke is a master at demonstrating Jesus' concern for others, a concern that comes through even in the midst of his own suffering. It's one of two main characteristics of his passion narrative. Let's look at

just a few examples. Let me remind you at this point that the vast majority of scripture scholars believe Mark wrote the original passion narrative. Matthew and Luke most likely had a copy of it in front of them when they composed their own narratives. When either evangelist differs from Mark, it is frequently at that point that he's putting his own unique theology into the specific narrative that bears his name. For instance, during the Last Supper passage, at the point where Jesus predicts Peter's denial of him, Luke's Jesus adds a prayer for his friend: "Simon, Simon, listen! Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat, but I have prayed

for you that your own faith may not fail; and you, once you have turned back, strengthen your brothers" (22:31-32). Jesus' pain doesn't blind him to the pain of others. Something similar happens in Gethsemane. In the other three Gospels, the high priest's servant walks out of the garden with his severed ear in his hand. But not in Luke! One of the disciples cut off the servant's right ear. But Jesus said in reply, "No more of this!" Then Jesus touched the servant's ear and healed him. Luke's Jesus is even concerned with the well-being of those who are determined to kill him. Nothing can stop him from giving himself to others. His concern continues even during his painful way of the cross. Only Luke tells us about the women who were so vocal in their support of him along the Way of the Cross. But notice how the evangelist turns their fears and anxiety about Jesus into Jesus' fears and anxiety about them. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me: weep instead for vourselves and vour children, for indeed, the days are coming ..." (23:27-29). Think about the best-known "last words" of Jesus - "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing" (23:34) And again, completely contradicting Mark's and Matthew's remark that "those who were crucified with him also reviled him," Luke provides us with one of scripture's most loved passages. One of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation!" ... Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, 'Amen, I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise' " Luke sees no extenuating circumstances, not even one's impending death, that would absolve a Christian from loving. This brings us to Luke's other major point: Jesus' innocence. No other evangelist stresses this aspect of Jesus' passion more than Luke. During the course of his narrative, he has four different people declare Jesus innocent: Pilate (at least three times); Herod; the good thief; and the centurion who crucified him. Notice how Luke has changed the Marcan centurion's proclamation, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" to "Certainly this man was innocent!" Even when Pilate delivers Jesus over for crucifixion, he never says he's guilty. The verdict of Pilate was that the crowd's demand should be granted. ... He handed Jesus over to them to deal with as they wished. Though he believes Jesus is innocent, the Roman procurator, to avoid a riot, simply gives in to mob rule. For Luke, Jesus' crucifixion is nothing but legalized murder. Yet even against this unjust background, his Jesus constantly cuts through the nonsense and loves both friends and enemies. This can only happen because he has emptied himself and looks at the situation he is in through the eyes of others, taking on their pain as his own. In the end, each one of the Gospel writers has something important to reveal to us - we accept that Jesus is innocent and we believe he is the Son of God. Listen with open ears as we now enter the holiest week of the Church year. For the grace to empty ourselves, that we may let go of control and rely on the power and love of God to sustain us each day...Lord, in vour mercv....
