STEWARDSHIP AND PARISH LIFE The Importance of Prayer

The foundation of every parish community can and must be prayer. Prayer is the building block that binds us together with the Lord, with each other and with ourselves. Every Sunday, we profess The Apostles Creed. Within that prayer of the Church, we profess our belief in the communion of saints. Along with all the angels and saints, we offer praise and glory to God and continue to express our gratitude for all that God has given to us. Prayer is our communication with a God who is loving and merciful and listens to us. Remember to listen, in the silence of our hearts, for what God wants to say. In our own lives, a daily practice of prayer is a commitment that can increase our own relationship with God and enrich our parish community with the foundation of prayer.

The Call to Discipleship John 1:47-51



Today's Gospel comes to us from Galilee as Jesus continues to gather together his disciples in the early days of his ministry. Philip has just agreed to follow Jesus and invites Nathanael to meet "Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." Nathanael's remark is very telling – "Can anything good come out of

Nazareth?" In order for Nathanael to see why Philip was so excited and willing to follow Jesus, he was going to have to overcome his own bias and prejudice against someone coming from such a sleepy, small town out in the provinces. Philip simply invites his friend to "Come and See." As Nathanael approaches, Jesus says, "Here is truly an Israelite, in whom there is no deceit." There aren't too many who received this kind of compliment from Jesus in the Gospels. Nathanael is a good and faithful person suffering from a biased and prejudiced opinion because of his culture and experience. To come and meet Jesus, he needs to step over his doubts and suspicion, his prejudice and bias and he is open enough to do so. Nathanael is puzzled. "Where did you get to know me?" (I've never seen you and this is my first time meeting you.) Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." Jesus is showing himself to Nathanael, as someone who is bigger than his own skepticism, prejudice and bias. Then Nathanael declares, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel." Nathanael's response is more than a statement. It is actually his faith confession. Upon meeting Jesus face to face and experiencing him, Nathanael confesses, — "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel." As believers, we too are called to follow Jesus. How do our prejudices and biases prevent us from truly living out our baptismal promises? Can we answer the call to step over those things that separate us from the path to follow Jesus? We are called to take the same first steps that mark Nathanael's journey. We are called to work for the Kingdom of God here and now, to create a place where all people are valued regardless of race, colour or creed. The concept of discipleship in the Gospel of John is to recognize who Jesus is just as Nathanael recognized Jesus as the Son of God. As we recognize Jesus as the Son of God, our discipleship is also about recognizing all who come from the Nazareths in our world.

<u>A Disciples Prayer</u>

Jesus, you call to my heart once more. "Leave anything that holds you back from deeper love. Come follow me, again and again." Grant me the courage to leave behind whatever keeps me from you and to trust you with my life. May my heart's connection with you be so strong and true that I will daily risk the road of following in your footsteps. Keep me open to the adventure of life where I meet you day by day. Remind me often of my inner goodness. Help me to believe that you look upon me with love. Thank you for the call to be your disciple. Amen. (taken from out of the ordinary: Joyce Rupp)
