

Here I am Lord, Send Me!



Have you ever read Where's Waldo? Originated in 1987 by British illustrator Martin Hanford, the character of "Waldo" has grown into a series of books offering readers a new opportunity to find the

elusive fellow on every page. In his full-page illustrations, Hanford produces collages of hundreds of people. In the colorful jumble, readers try to find a bespectacled, bobble-headed man dressed in a red-and-white-striped shirt with blue pants, carrying a walking stick. Because the backdrop against which he appears is always different, sometimes young and inexperienced eyes need help in their search. But Waldo is always the same, and discovering him is always a happy accomplishment.

In a sense, believers' search for the presence of God can be similarly challenging. Set against the vast and varied backdrop of the human condition, God's presence seems elusive at times, even indiscernible. Although believers may be intellectually convinced that God is present, it may still be difficult for them to satisfy their deep desire to experience God in a palpable manner. For this reason, God in all love and compassion has sent guides and mentors to move among us, to help us discern the face, touch and handiwork of God by pointing our searching eyes, minds and hearts in the right direction.

In today's sacred texts, we become acquainted yet again with some of these keen discerners of the workings of God. Although we call them by different names — prophet, disciple, evangelist, pastor — all are essentially believers whose privilege and responsibility it is to lead others to discover God. In describing their special service, Abraham Joshua Heschel once said the world is dark and human agony is excruciating, but the believer casts a light by which the heart is led into the thinking of God's mind (The Prophets, Hendrickson Publishers, Peabody, Mass.: 2001). Centuries before the late Rabbi Heschel, a 12th-century German abbess named Hildegard described these special souls as "those who see with the spirit's eyes. In illuminating darkness, they speak out. They are living, penetrating clarity. They are a blossom, blooming only on the shoot that is rooted in the flood of light."

Isaiah of Jerusalem blossomed and shed his light in eighth-century B.C.E. Judah at a time when a great

darkness was threatening their very existence. Politically, the southern kingdom of Judah was trying to stave off the aggression of the Assyrian armies that had already taken over the northern kingdom of Israel. Weak leadership in Judah sought alliances with other nations against their enemies, but Isaiah tried to keep the eyes of his people solely on God. When God seemed elusive, or deaf to their entreaties, Isaiah kept his focus.

Paul offered a similar service to the Corinthians and to all he had helped to discern the face of Jesus in the midst of so many other alluring figures. Over and against other attractions, Paul held out the truth of the Gospel and the power of Jesus to save. Today's second reading celebrates the *kerygma* — the proclamation of Jesus — and reminds all who search for meaning in their lives that unless that search leads them to Jesus, all their seeking is in vain. But for those who seek with eyes of faith and ears open in hope, the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus will become a source of life, here and hereafter.

Featured in today's Gospel are Peter, James and John, who thought they had found their place in life as fishermen. No doubt Isaiah of Jerusalem had the same sense of himself as he served his people as high priest. Paul, too, had known security in his vocation as a Pharisee, with the responsibility to keep his community orthodox and free of heretical elements. But when the presence of God broadened their spiritual horizons, Isaiah and Paul, Peter, James and John realized that their life's search had only just begun.

Like those who must find the figure of Waldo in a new setting on every page, these heroes of our faith were called to discover the plan of God for them in ever new and evolving circumstances. Isaiah the priest would also be Isaiah the prophet; Paul the persecutor would become Paul the proclaimer of the Good News of Jesus; and Peter, James and John would help others to navigate the complexity of human experience and find the face of God in the words and works of Jesus Christ. We honour these heroes by continuing their mission. Now it is our turn to help others recognize the face of God. Are you ready? Can you join Isaiah in proclaiming "Here am I; send me!"
