Amos 6:1a, 4-7 1 Tim 6:11-16 Psalm 146 Luke 16:19-31

Reflection on First Reading from Amos



St. Oscar Romero, Archbishop of El Salvador, who died as a martyr for Christ and the poor in 1980, was not afraid to preach the truth. His voice rang out in defense of those who were being victimized every day by an unjust government. In a homily just one year and one month before his death, he

insisted that "to try to preach without referring to the history one preaches in, is not to preach the Gospel. Many would like a preaching so spiritualized that it leaves sinners unbothered and does not term idolaters

those who kneel before money and power - a preaching that says nothing about the sinful environment in which the Gospel is reflected upon is not the Gospel" (The Violence of Love, The Plough Publishing House, Farmington, Pa.: 1998).

Amos was of a similar mind; he could not speak for God without referencing those human attitudes and behaviors that were clearly in contradiction to God and to God's good news. For that reason, Amos castigated his wealthy northern neighbors and warned them that their selfishness and complacency would end badly. He had not chosen to be God's whistle-blower. Amos had been content with his life in his hometown of Tekoa in Judah, as the shepherd of a particularly rugged breed of sheep as well as a dresser of sycamore trees. His pastoral and agricultural work required all of his efforts and attention. Nevertheless, when called by God to speak the truth to the injustices that were being perpetuated against the poor in the northern kingdom of Israel, he went and did as God commanded.

Wealth had afforded his eighth-century B.C.E. listeners many luxuries. Their fine beds inlaid with ivory panels, their banquets of veal and lamb, their leisurely cocktail parties and fine music stood out in sharp contrast to the straw pallets of the poor, with their meager diet and daily struggle to eke out an existence. Amos regarded these iniquities as sinful and said as much. Moreover, he warned that the political fortunes of Israel were in jeopardy because of their disregard for God's poor ones. Whether Amos, whose prophetic ministry was exercised sometime during the 40-year reign of Uzziah of Judah (781-743 B.C.E.), lived to see his warning realized, we cannot know. However, as history attests, the northern kingdom of Israel fell to the Assyrians circa 722 B.C.E., and indeed, as he had said, the rich were the first to be sent into exile. Nevermore would the northern kingdom enjoy its freedoms; in addition, the luxuries that the prophet had described as wanton became a distant memory.

While exile and the loss of our wealth do not hang over our heads like the sword of Damocles, we are nevertheless to take Amos' words to heart, not out of fear for our own losses but for the love of God and our neighbour. Amos' words challenge us to use our wealth as citizens of one of the richest countries in the world in order to ease the paths of others. Whether it is the euro, the dollar, the pound, the yen, the dinar, the yuan or the rand, the only wealth worth having is the wealth we are willing to share.

God, who demands justice for the oppressed, we pray for the compassion, courage and generosity to see and respond to those who need our help. Do not allow us to be callous or complacent, for we long to be your righteous people. We ask these things in the name of Jesus. Amen.
