### Are you able to host a Ukrainian family?

When hearing reports of the war in Ukraine, and the millions of Ukrainians that have been forced to flee their homeland, many have asked what they can do to help. Over 80,000 Ukrainians have already arrived to Canada through a special visa program created by Immigration Canada. An additional 500,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived. #### **Love and Gratitude**



Even a cursory perusal of the Lucan Gospel illustrates that the evangelist intends to affirm God's all-inclusive love and universal concerns, as these are revealed in Jesus. In Luke, readers will see Jesus reaching out to the poor, to sinners, to tax collectors, to women and to foreigners. In today's Gospel,

Jesus extends himself and his healing power to people whom others took every precaution to avoid - lepers. From Luke's description ("keeping their distance"), we may safely assume that the 10 individuals who called out to Jesus for pity did suffer from Hansen's disease. Jesus' directive, "Go, show yourselves to the priests," was in keeping with the law that required priestly approval before an afflicted person could rejoin the community. All obeyed Jesus, and all were healed. But a deep, passionate gratitude compelled one of them to return to Jesus. As the healed one glorified God and honoured Jesus so reverently, his faith became obvious and Jesus acknowledged it with a promise of salvation.

Luke's narrative offers a lesson on gratitude as the proper response to God's many blessings. But that is not all. Luke's narrative also affirms that the messianic blessings of healing and salvation were to be enjoyed by all of humankind, even by Samaritans, whom the Jews did not respect. Also in evidence here is the contrast between the many Jews who rejected Jesus and those who, though they were regarded as outsiders (e.g., the Samaritans), accepted Jesus and believed in him. At work in this text as well is the distinction between being healed and being saved. The Samaritan leper's healing taught him a new way of relating to God. He became intensely aware that his life was a miraculous gift. He learned to trust God and celebrate every moment. Healing is salvation when we acknowledge God's gracious initiative and when our response to that initiative is

faith. Many who receive God's blessings only take them. Others are led by them into a life of blessedness.

At its first level of development during the ministry of Jesus, the narrative challenged his listeners to set aside their prejudices and acknowledge that God is a God for all peoples and that faith can grow and flourish even in those whom others might dismiss as unlikely believers. By the time the narrative was circulating in the Lucan community of the 80s, it helped to inspire and direct the church's *mission*. If they were to be true to his example and leadership, Jesus' disciples were to sow the seeds of the good news without discrimination. Nor could they pass judgment on the worthiness of those to whom they were called to minister.

. Following his heart rather than Jesus' orders, the 10th leper was so driven by the experience of being made whole and free and newly alive that he could not help himself. He was compelled by such passionate love and gratitude that he had to return to the One who had made it so. This is the same love and gratitude that should drive us to return again and again to the great feast of thanksgiving that we call Eucharist. Gathered together each week, we hear the words of Jesus that challenge us to be healed of our pride, selfishness, anger, apathy, laziness and deceit. We are reminded to serve the needs of others, particularly the poor among us. We eat the bread of life that nourishes us and heals our brokenness. Then we are sent out into the rest of the week to witness to all that we have known in Jesus. We work, we serve, we pray, we love, we remember and give thanks for all God's gifts until we are drawn yet again to give thanks at Eucharist. Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!
