# A LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS



The feast of the Epiphany focuses our faith on Jesus as both the fulfillment of the promises made to Israel and as the source of universal salvation. all revealed to the nations. The images of bright light, both in the star over Bethlehem and in later references to the

appearance in Galilee of a light to "the people that lived in darkness and the shadow of death," are powerful ways of saying that God reveals salvation in Jesus. Human destiny is changed by his entry into human history.

If you have experienced being in a room when someone walked in who "lit up the place," you know the possibility of a "small e" epiphany. It may be a beautiful man or woman, a couple in love, a charming child or a long-lost friend, but you feel that something has occurred to change the whole atmosphere, if not for everyone then at least for you.

We can grasp "Big E" epiphanies because of the smaller experiences, and with eyes of faith, we can enter a moment that is theological in nature - a matter of spiritual power, which can either build to overflowing or occur suddenly. We feel it but we may not be able to grasp or articulate its meaning. God is revealed. All lesser concerns fall away. We are in the presence of Glory. Something absolute has broken into our world of relative circumstances, and it lifts us up, imprints itself on us, changes us deeply.

This is what Matthew conveys to his audience in the story of the magi. Jesus is a "light to the nations," and, while Herod reacts violently, others find Jesus' coming to be good news, a life-changing fulfillment of God's promise to send a saviour — the literal meaning of

Jesus' name. We are the audience for this Gospel today, and a living Word invites us to see with the eves of faith that Jesus is in the world for us, to guide us out of darkness into clarity about who we are and what God is offering us. Our identity was revealed in baptism. A lighted candle was entrusted to us through our parents that signified God's life within us and our mission to be "light to the world." However small our personal vocation, a single Christ-bearer can have a significant impact on the lives of others. The darker the night, the brighter that one candle can be. The power of Christ's Epiphany enables us to go precisely to those places where darkness rules, where people live in the shadow of death. Our baptismal call is wasted if we nurture and protect the light God gave us only for our own spiritual comfort. In fact, the light grows dim if we do not use it and grows brighter if we do.

Where can we take the light? Who lives in the shadow of fear and at the margins of hope? Can we name them? The poor, those trapped in crime-ridden neighborhoods, newly arrived immigrants, documented and undocumented, the homeless and mentally ill people on our streets, those in jails and prisons without advocates. How do we help them? What do we do to alleviate their plight? Finally, perhaps the most intimate and difficult opportunities to be light in the darkness are in our families, our inner circle of need and responsibility.

If others were to judge, just how bright does our light burn? Where will we carry Christ today? We are called to continue in our discovery of how bright our light can burn and where we will carry this light today, tomorrow and for all of 2023. Happy New Year!
