FEAST OF PENTECOST

Reflection on WARTS 2011 in Instoronto.ca



In a speech he delivered before more than a quarter of a million people gathered at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. in 1963, pastor and civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. appealed for the same sort of mutual respect and universal understanding that was being celebrated more than two

millennia ago at Pentecost in Jerusalem. King addressed people who had come from all over the United States with all their differing ideals and experiences.

"I have a dream," intoned King, "that one day in Georgia, the sons of former slaves and the sons of slave owners will be able to sit down together ... that Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heart of injustice, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice ... from New Hampshire, New York, Pennsylvania, Colorado, California and Tennessee ... all God's children black and white, Jews and Gentiles, Protestants and Catholics, will join hands and sing ..."

King's dream of unity among the world's different peoples affirms that what happened that long-ago day in Jerusalem was not an end in itself but the beginning of a process that continues to this day. To affirm the significance of that moment and the importance of the gift of the Spirit, Luke called upon dramatic witnesses — a noise like a driving wind, tongues as of fire, people speaking in different tongues. Then, when he had everyone's attention, he affirmed that all of them heard, in their own native tongues, proclamation of the mighty acts of God. All those acts came to their culmination in the Christ-event, when their Lord and brother Jesus suffered and died and rose to life, sending forth his saving Spirit to live with and within his followers forever.

In his first volume, the Lucan evangelist emphasized the constant presence of the Spirit with Jesus. More than the other Synoptics and even more than the Johannine evangelist, Luke referenced the Holy Spirit 17 times in his Gospel. In Acts, the Spirit's presence is attested 57 times, every mention of which was meant to affirm the continuity between Luke and Acts. This continuity offered assurance (Luke 1:4) to Luke's readers that the work Jesus had begun was being carried on by his followers in a legitimate fashion, because the same Spirit who empowered Jesus continued to empower the community of his followers. In Acts, as Joseph Fitzmyer has explained, Luke presented what he believed to be the third period of salvation history: that of the church Gospel According (The Doubleday, New York: 1984). In this period, the promises of both Testaments are fulfilled and the Spirit is given to the people of God as a whole.

That same Spirit continues to blow and breathe among us just as dramatically and freely and powerfully as when the Spirit's presence was first sent among us. Without this Spirit, the Way would remain unwalkable, the Truth unknowable and the Life unlivable. But, as John Chrysostom has assured us, with the Spirit, "we are not only free but also holy, not only holy but also just, not only just but also children and heirs and brothers and sisters of Christ." In that capacity, we are empowered by the Spirit's gift of understanding to be brothers and sisters to one another. Can we become what we celebrate?

For the church, that we may faithfully confess Jesus as Lord and be guided by the Holy Spirit to continue the mission of Christ in our time...We pray...

For Christian unity, that the Spirit may heal the divisions that exist, bring down the walls of mistrust and help us to pray and work together in God's service...We pray..
